NOTE:-

- eAG is directly related to A1c.
- An A1c of 7% -the goal for most people with diabetes-is the equivalent of an eAG of 154 mg/dl.
- eAG may help facilitate a better understanding of actual daily control helping you and your health care provider to make necessary changes to your diet and physical activity to improve overall diabetes mnagement.

The following ranges may be used for interpretation of results. However, factors such as duration of diabetes, adherence to therapy and the age of the patient should also be considered in assessing the degree of blood glucose control.

*High risk of developing long term complications such as Retinopathy, Nephropathy, Neuropathy, Cardiopathy, etc. **Some danger of hypoglycemic reaction in Type 1 diabetics. Some glucose intolerant individuals and "subclinical" diabetics may demonstrate HbA1C levels in this area.

<u>Clinical Implications:</u>

*Values are frequently increased in persons with poorly controlled or newly diagnosed diabetes.

*With optimal control, the HbA 1c moves toward normal levels.

*A diabetic patient who recently comes under good control may still show higher concentrations of glycosylated hemoglobin. This level declines gradually over several months as nearly normal glycosylated *Increases in glycosylated hemoglobin occur in the following non-diabetic conditions: a. Iron-deficiency anemia b. Splenectomy

*Decreases in A 1c occur in the following non-diabetic conditions: a. Hemolytic anemia b. chronic blood loss

*Pregnancy d. chronic renal failure. Interfering Factors:

*Presence of Hb F and H causes falsely elevated values. 2. Presence of Hb S, C, E, D, G, and Lepore (autosomal recessive mutation resulting in a hemoglobinopathy) causes falsely decreased values.

1) Patients having low T3 and T4 levels but high TSH levels suffer from primary hypothyroidism, cretinism, juvenile myxedema or autoimmune disorders.

2) Patients having high T3 and T4 levels but low TSH levels suffer from Grave's disease, toxic adenoma or sub-acute thyroiditis.

3) Patients having either low or normal T3 and T4 levels but low TSH values suffer from iodine deficiency or secondary hypothyroidism.

4) Patients having high T3 and T4 levels but normal TSH levels may suffer from toxic multinodular goiter. This condition is mostly a symptomatic and may cause transient hyperthyroidism but no persistent symptoms.

5) Patients with high or normal T3 and T4 levels and low or normal TSH levels suffer either from T3 toxicosis or T4 toxicosis respectively.

6) In patients with non thyroidal illness abnormal test results are not necessarily indicative of thyroidism but may be due to adaptation to the catabolic state and may revert to normal when the patient recovers.

7) There are many drugs for eg. Glucocorticoids, Dopamine, Lithium, Iodides, Oral radiographic dyes, etc. which may affect the thyroid function tests.

8) Generally when total T3 and total T4 results are indecisive then Free T3 and Free T4 tests are recommended for further confirmation along with TSH levels.

CHEST P-A VIEW

- Soft tissue shadow appears normal.
- Bony cage is normal.
- Diaphragmatic shadows are normal on both sides.
- Costo-phrenic angles are bilaterally clear.
- Trachea is central in position.
- Cardiac size & contours are normal.
- Hilar shadows are normal.
- Pulmonary vascularity & distribution are normal.
- Pulmonary parenchyma did not reveal any significant lesion.

ULTRASOUND WHOLE ABDOMEN (UPPER & LOWER) *

<u>LIVER</u>

• Liver is mildly enlarged in size measuring 15.7 cm in longitudinal span & shows mild diffuse increase in parenchymal echogenicity.

PORTAL SYSTEM

- The intra hepatic portal channels are normal.
- Portal vein is normal at the porta.
- Porta hepatis is normal.

BILIARY SYSTEM

- The intra-hepatic biliary radicles are normal.
- Common duct is normal at the porta. (4.4 mm)
- The gall bladder is normal in size and has regular walls. Wall thickness is normal. Lumen of the gall bladder is anechoic.

PANCREAS

• The pancreas is normal in size and shape and has a normal homogenous echotexture.

<u>RIGHT KIDNEY (10.4 x 3.9 cm)</u>

- Right kidney is normal in size and shape and cortical echotexture.
- The collecting system is not dilated.
- The upper part of right ureter is normal.
- The vesicoureteric junction is normal.
- Corticomedullary demarcation is clear.
- Renal respiratory excursions are normal.

LEFT KIDNEY (11.5 x 5.1 cm)

- Left kidney is normal in size and shape and cortical echotexture.
- The collecting system is not dilated.
- The upper part of left ureter is normal.
- The vesicoureteric junction is normal.
- Corticomedullary demarcation is clear.
- Renal respiratory excursions are normal.



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<u>SPLEEN</u>

• The spleen is normal in size (10.8 cm) and has a homogenous echotexture.

ILIAC FOSSA

• Scan over the iliac fossae does not reveal any fluid collection or mass.

URINARY BLADDER

• The urinary bladder is normal. Bladder wall is normal in thickness and regular.

<u>UTERUS</u>

- The uterus is anteverted and anteflexed position and is normal in size measures 8.7 x 5.8 x 4.3 cm.
- It has a homogenous myometrial echotexture. (10.5 mm)
- The endometrium is seen in midline.
- Cervix is normal.

UTERINE ADNEXA

- Adnexa on both sides are normal.
- Right ovary measures 2.5 x 1.4 cm.
- Left ovary measures 2.1 x 1.1 cm.
- Both the ovaries are normal in size.


CUL-DE-SAC

• Pouch of Douglas is clear.

IMPRESSION

• Mild hepatomegaly with grade - I fatty infiltration of liver.
