- An A1c of 7% -the goal for most people with diabetes-is the equivalent of an eAG of 154 mg/dl.

Clinical Implications:

- *Values are frequently increased in persons with poorly controlled or newly diagnosed diabetes.
- *With optimal control, the HbA 1c moves toward normal levels.
- *A diabetic patient who recently comes under good control may still show higher concentrations of glycosylated hemoglobin. This level declines gradually over several months as nearly normal glycosylated *Increases in glycosylated hemoglobin occur in the following non-diabetic conditions: a. Iron-deficiency anemia b. Splenectomy

Interpretation:

- 1. PSA is detected in the serum of males with normal, benign hypertrophic, and malignant prostate tissue.
- 2. Measurement of serum PSA levels is not recommended as a screening procedure for the diagnosis of cancer because elevated PSA levels also are observed in patients with benign prostatic hypertrophy. However, studies suggest that the measurement of PSA in conjunction with digital rectal examination (DRE) and ultrasound provide a better method of detecting prostate cancer than DRE alone.
- 3. PSA levels increase in men with cancer of the prostate, and after radical prostatectomy PSA levels routinely fall to the undetectable range.
- 4. If prostatic tissue remains after surgery or metastasis has occurred, PSA appears to be useful in detecting residual and early recurrence of tumor.
- 5. Therefore, serial PSA levels can help determine the success of prostatectomy, and the need for further treatment, such as radiation, endocrine or chemotherapy, and in the monitoring of the effectiveness of therapy.

- 2) Patients having high T3 and T4 levels but low TSH levels suffer from Grave's disease, toxic adenoma or sub-acute thyroiditis.
- 3) Patients having either low or normal T3 and T4 levels but low TSH values suffer from iodine deficiency or secondary hypothyroidism.
- **4)** Patients having high T3 and T4 levels but normal TSH levels may suffer from toxic multinodular goiter. This condition is mostly a symptomatic and may cause transient hyperthyroidism but no persistent symptoms.
- 5) Patients with high or normal T3 and T4 levels and low or normal TSH levels suffer either from T3 toxicosis or T4 toxicosis respectively.
- 6) In patients with non thyroidal illness abnormal test results are not necessarily indicative of thyroidism but may be due to adaptation to the catabolic state and may revert to normal when the patient recovers.
- 7) There are many drugs for eg. Glucocorticoids, Dopamine, Lithium, Iodides, Oral radiographic dyes, etc. which may affect the thyroid function tests.
- 8) Generally when total T3 and total T4 results are indecisive then Free T3 and Free T4 tests are recommended for further confirmation along with TSH levels.

LIVER

 Mild hepatomegaly present, measures 157.3 mm in cranio caudal extent, shows diffuse bright echoes. No focal lesion is seen.

PORTAL SYSTEM

- The intra hepatic portal channels are normal.
- Portal vein is normal at the porta.
- Porta hepatis is normal.

BILIARY SYSTEM

- The intra-hepatic biliary radicles are normal.
- Common duct are normal at the porta.
- The gall bladder is normal in size and has regular walls. Wall thickness is normal. Lumen of the gall bladder is anechoic.

PANCREAS

• The pancreas is normal in size and shape and has a normal homogenous echotexture.

RIGHT KIDNEY

- Right kidney is normal in size and shape and cortical echotexture.
- The collecting system is not dilated.
- The upper part of right ureter is normal.
- The vesicoureteric junction is normal.
- Corticomedullary demarcation is clear.
- Renal respiratory excursions are normal.

LEFT KIDNEY

- Left kidney is normal in size and shape and cortical echotexture.
- Cortical cyst seen involving upper pole, measures 45.3 x 29.5 mms approx.
- The collecting system is not dilated.
- The upper part of left ureter is normal.
- The vesicoureteric junction is normal.
- Corticomedullary demarcation is clear.
- Renal respiratory excursions are normal.
